Year 1 Newsletter Advent Term 2019

English

This half term, we will be reading the story of
The Three Little Pigs. The children will use a story
map to help order the events of the story and use
role play to demonstrate their understanding. The
children will then learn how to write their own
version of the story by changing one of the
elements in it e.g. the main characters.

Mathematics

This term we will be focusing on recognising and ordering the numbers 1-20 and forming them correctly. The children will be applying this learning to enable them to solve addition and subtraction problems independently.

Topic and Science

During our topic 'Ourselves', the children will be thinking about their own likes and dislikes, describing their own appearance and learning about places where their families live.

In Science, the children will be looking at a variety of everyday materials, such as wood and plastic.

They will be using what they have learnt to describe how these materials are used.

Phonics

As part of reading and writing, it is important that the children are confident in recognising, reading and writing letter names and sounds, including digraphs (2 letters which make 1 sound, e·g· 'ow') and trigraphs (3 letters which make 1 sound, e·g· 'igh')· Please practise these at home and encourage your child to use their knowledge of these when sounding out words during reading, for example, n - igh - t rather than n-i-g-h-t·

Religious Education

This half term we will be focusing on our topic of 'Families'. The children will be thinking about their own families, other families and how we are all special. We also move onto the topic of 'Belonging'. The children will recognise different groups they belong to, as well as belonging to the Church.
